DECISIONS OF THE ASSEMBLY OF THE AFRICAN UNION DURING THE EIGHTEENTH ORDINARY SESSION FROM 29TH TO 30TH JANUARY 2012, ADDIS ABABA, ETHIOPIA

During their last AU summit at the auspices of the New African Union Headquaters Complex in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia all the Heads of State from Africa decided to recognize the life and work of Wangari Muta Maathai, the founder Distinguished Chair of Wangari Maathai Institute for Peace and Environmental Studies.

Among other decisions, the Summit encourages the AU Commission, within the framework of the Make Peace Happen Campaign (MPHC), as well as member States, the private sector, the African Development Bank (AfDB), the United Nations Environmental Program (UNEP) and other related international organizations and foundations, in cooperation with the Green Belt Movement (GBM), to take all the necessary measures in support of

as an

African Centre of Excellence, to encourage research on environmental governance and its linkages with peace, human rights and democracy in Africa.
